

Sean is married to Julie and has two children.

He served as Secretary of the United Service Club Queensland from 3 February 2014 to 29 June 2018, during which time the Club celebrated its 125th anniversary. A major administrative achievement was the completion of a comprehensive asset condition and maintenance/replacement assessment; and the resulting triennial CAPEX budget was established.

This resulted in significant works to the Club's premises including:

- the refurbishment to the 4th floor administration offices
- installation of a "deadman anchor system" to stabilise the Wickham Terrace retaining wall
- resurfacing of the Wickham Terrace street terrace
- restoration of the Greenhouse façade
- implementation of a 5-year cyclical maintenance program to protect and maintain all Greenhouse external surfaces
- carpet replacement for the Greenhouse
- · replacement of the kitchen and bar floor
- demolition of the old parking attendant booth

In addition, significant projects were undertaken in the Club's administration and governance, including:

- a new Club website with secure Members' area was designed and launched,
- a comprehensive Workplace Health and Safety manual was implemented,
- a staff training program was implemented
- a premises and facilities inspection and review regime was implemented
- preliminary works were undertaken in preparation for the Club to apply to be incorporated
- the Club changed its auditors.

During his tenure as Secretary, Mr Moroney served Presidents Major Jenny Walker, Brigadier Ray McNab CSC, RFD, and Assistant Commissioner Paul Doyle APM.
